

Every year, the European Society of Authors publishes a list of under-translated or forgotten works called Finnegan's List, made of recommendations from 10 prominent writers from around the world.

The idea is simple: each author selects three titles from his or her personal library – fiction or non-fiction, prose or poetry – and briefly explains what makes them worth putting forward. The name of the list is an unabashed nod to James Joyce's Finnegans Wake, a novel whose principle of great linguistic polyphony is one shared by this project.

Since May 2013, Finnegan's List is also part of Schwob, a Europe-wide initiative. Together with our partners we will work toward building a European portal for the promotion of forgotten modern classics, helping them to be translated into different languages.

On June 8, 2013, Ilma Rakusa, Gabriela Adameşteanu and György Dragomán will speak about their picks for Finnegan's List. László Földényi, Finnegan's List 2014 committee member, will host the event.
